As we begin a new year, we would like to start with a "Kindness Challenge." Our challenge to you is this...

We are asking everyone in our school community-teachers, principals, staff members and students- to each perform 5 acts of kindness daily for 3 weeks. We would like you to report each week. If you have multiple students at Hidden Hollow, have each child report their acts of kindness to their own teacher. For all members of your family who do not attend Hidden Hollow, please include their acts of kindness on one of the students forms.

As a staff, we will also be tracking our success. Just as a staff, if we complete this challenge, we will perform 7,350 acts of kindness. If we add each child, it will add up to nearly 100,000 acts of kindness.

At the end of each day please write the number of Kind acts associated with the corresponding date. Because the challenge is 3 weeks, we have included 3 weekly trackers on the bottom of the sheet. The trackers are Monday-Sunday, so please send it with your child on the following Monday.

Remember that each Kind act may be as simple as opening the door for someone in need, or carrying something inside for someone. It might also include cleaning up a room in the house, or helping make a meal at home. You choose, but we would LOVE to have everyone involved.

SAFETY FOR EVERY CHILD Hidden Hollow Pick-Up/Drop-Off Procedures



THE SAFETY OF OUR STUDENTS IS THE NUMBER ONE GOAL DURING PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF. Working together, we can make sure that every student is safe while using school parking areas.

WE ARE EXCITED ABOUT OUR NEW "SHORTCUT" SIDEWALK. A huge thank you to Alpine School District in helping us complete this project. This sidewalk allows students to directly enter and exit the school grounds without using the crosswalks that slow traffic.

We have already seen results! We have seen a decrease in the entry and dismissal times from approximately 12 minutes to 6 minutes.

We must remember these safety rules:

- 1. Please make sure students only enter and exit vehicles in the right lane and from the *passenger side* of the vehicle only.
- 2. The left lane of the parking lot is for drive-thru only. *Never load or unload children in the left lane.*
- 3. Load and unload children only in the marked load/unload zone. Please do not attempt to load or drop off children using the new shortcut sidewalk. Caution tape marks this area, intended only for pedestrians entering and exiting the school.
- 4. Please *pull forward* to orange cones as space becomes available in front of you.
- 5. No parking/leaving vehicles unattended in loading/unloading zone during pick-up and drop-off times.
- 6. The south lot contains a bus zone. Please do not load and unload within the bus zone.
- 7. If you choose to pick up students away from the load/unload zone, we ask that you walk them to and from your vehicle, using the designated crosswalks.
- 8. Students who remain on the sidewalk and load/unload zone for more than 10 minutes after school will be moved into the vestibule area next to the office.

School staff will be working to make sure that all understand and follow these rules. Your help and cooperation can make this a safe place for everyone.




New sidewalk
